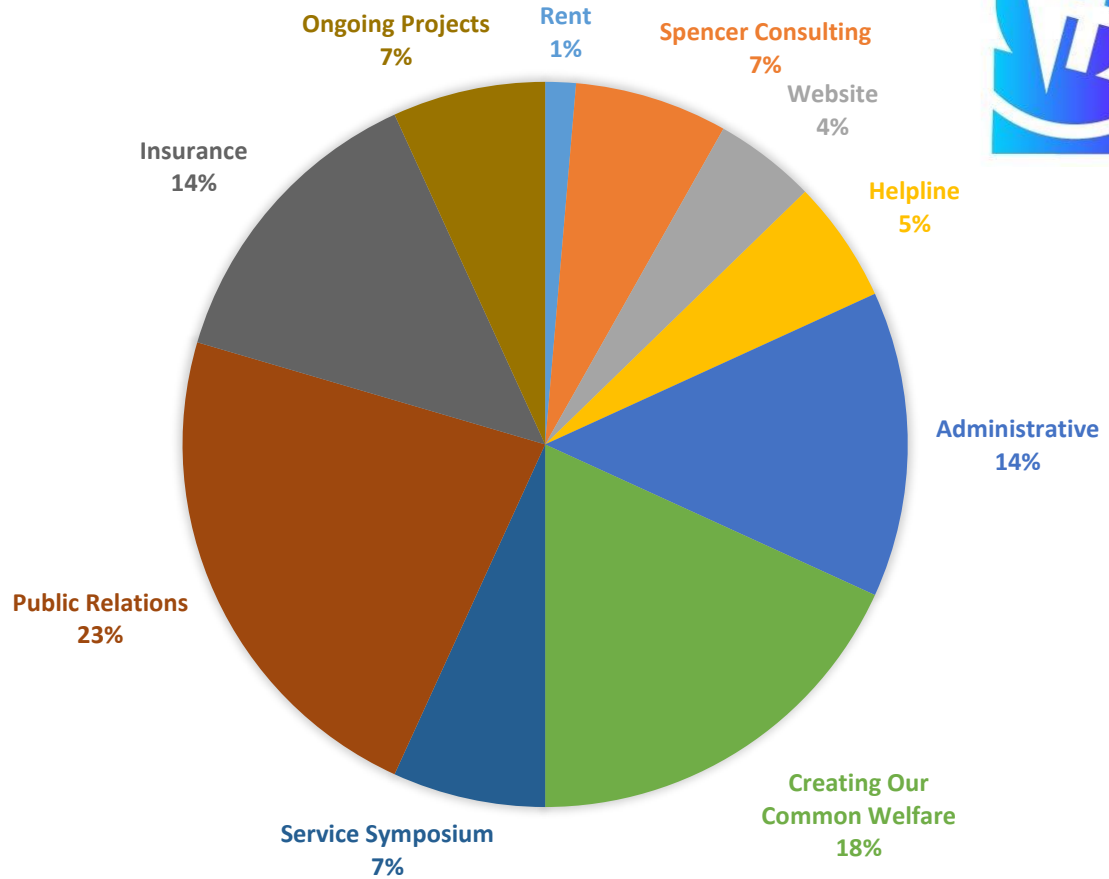

Digital Project Team Report – October 8th, 2019

Website Enhancements

Our website continues to be a work in progress. We try to keep up with new WordPress technology as it is released. The enhancement queue includes:

- Currently "YAP" is handling the meeting list information for the NAMN Helpline. Shortly, we will be migrating the entire Helpline over to YAP. This will generate changes and fewer options in the existing telephone menu. However, using YAP will ultimately improve helpline accuracy while significantly reducing monthly expenses.
- The Digital Project Team will be transitioning from using "Join.me" to "Zoom" for operating our monthly webinars and FST calls. We are making this change due to multiple concerns with the reliability of "Join.me" for our users. More information will be announced as we move forward with this.
- The Digital Project Team has recently incorporated "Mapline" into the Bridging the Gap program. This will allow us to see on a custom map the closest BtG volunteers that could respond to a BtG request. Using Mapline in conjunction with efficient communication will allow us to provide the best customer service possible.

Regional Web Servant Training

My name is Rebecca C. and I am currently the Project Manager for the NAMN Digital Project Team. In August of this year I had the opportunity to attend the Wordpress Wordcamp Convention in Minneapolis, MN for continued training in the role of Regional Web Servant. I attended this convention at the funding of the MNRSC; in suggestion of, and in attendance with, Jeff S. the former MNRSC Regional Web Servant.

The Wordpress Wordcamp Convention is designed for all skill levels of people interested in Web Design and Computer Technology. The convention was held at the stunningly beautiful University of MN McNamara Alumni Center. The weekend format was much like a Narcotics Anonymous Convention, filled with educational workshops and individual presenters. I took lots of notes and tried to make social connections while I was there. I even had the opportunity to do one-on-one questions and answers with several professionals in the field. I would highly recommend this experience for any member interested in serving in the future capacity of Regional Web Servant.

In reflection, I feel truly humbled to have had the opportunity to attend an event like Wordcamp. 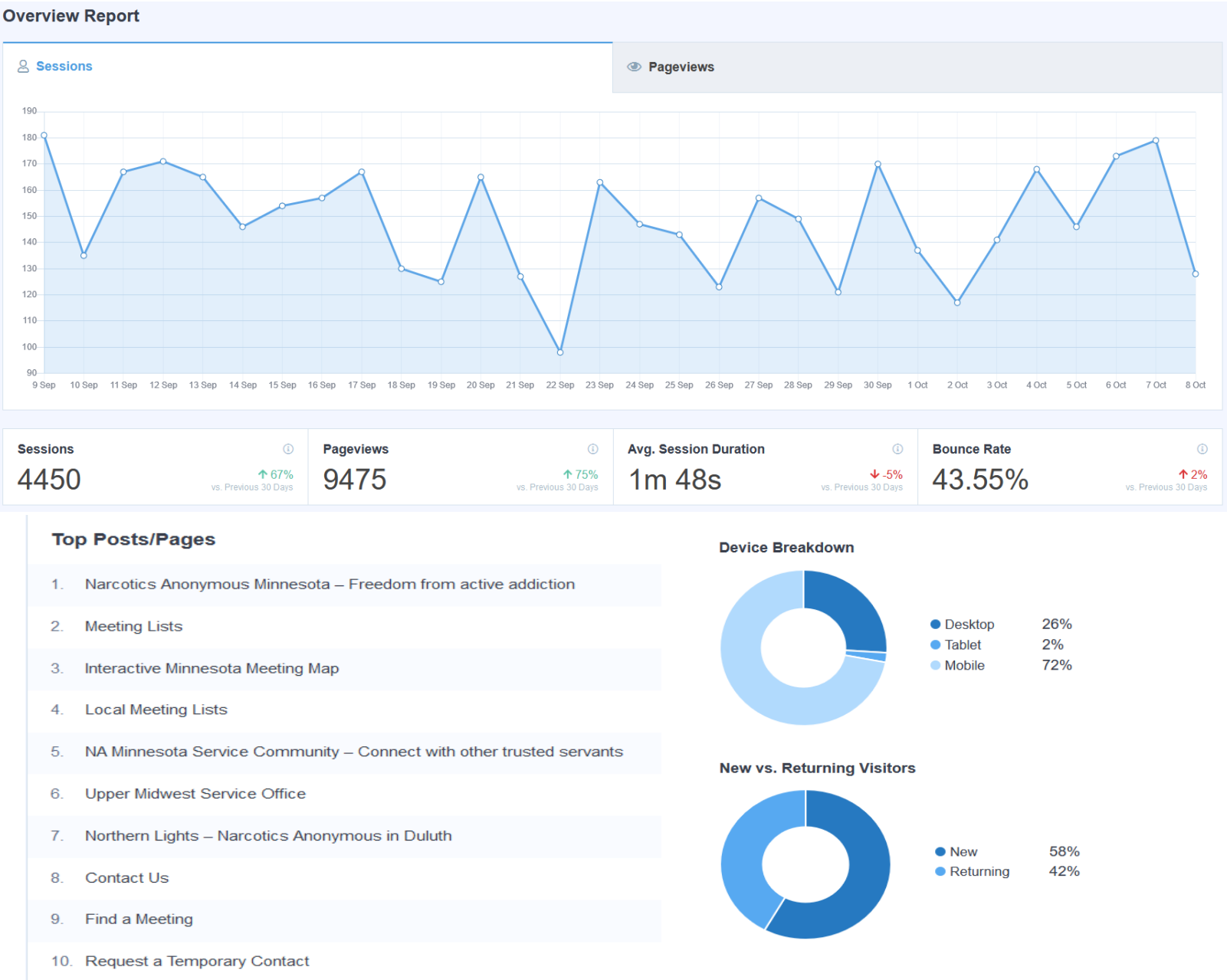
Monthly Web Servant Training

Our next training session is scheduled for: Wednesday, November 6th @ 7:00 pm – 9:00 pm

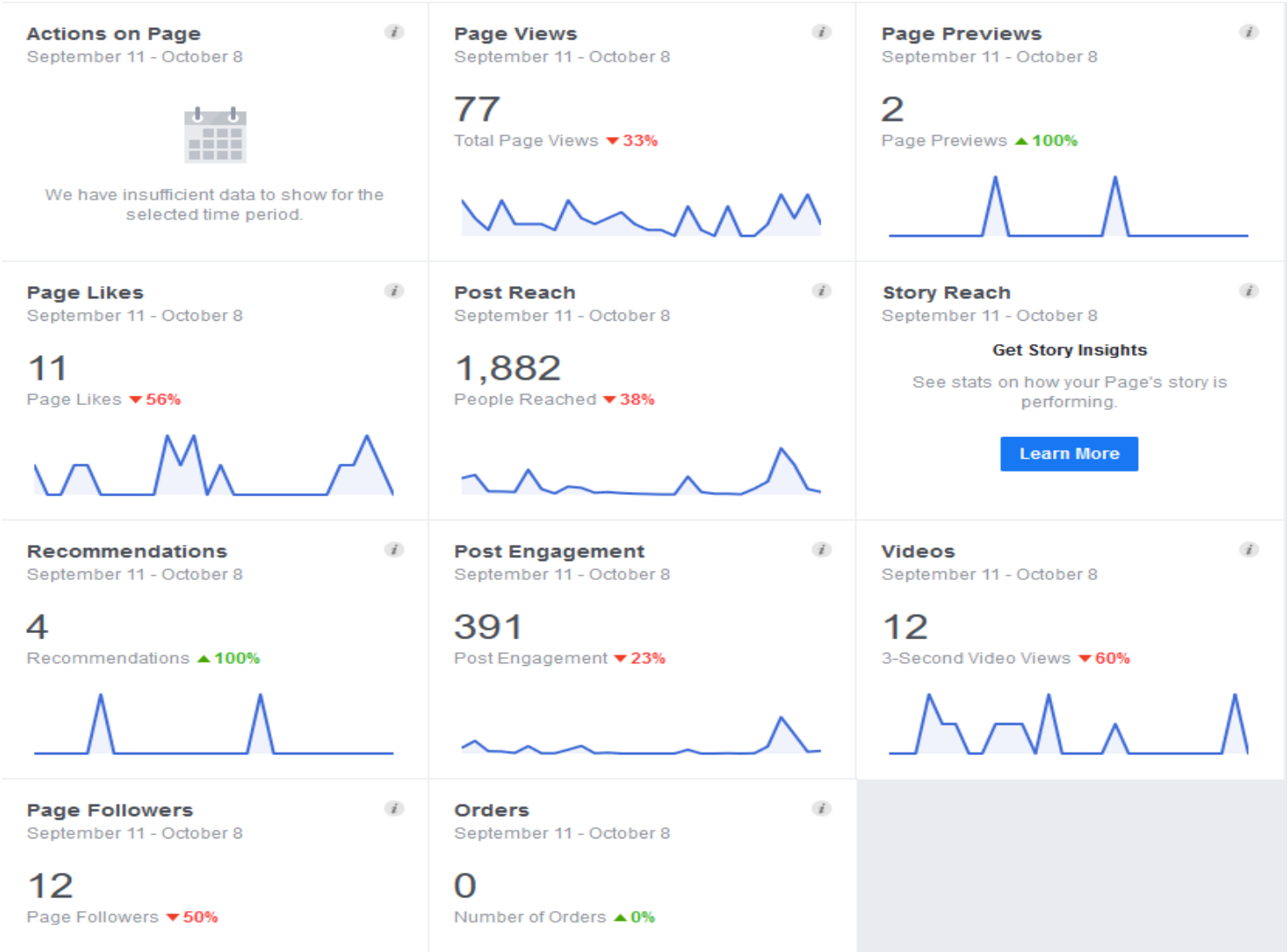
Naminnnesota.org Website Performance Metrics

Operational Rule Changes

- Change to the Inspection Clause to reflect WSC 2018 discussions and clarify that only the WSC can act for the beneficiary- the NA fellowship as a whole
- Various “housekeeping” edits:
 - Change description of WSC Boards and Committees to the World Board
 - Section 12: Trustee Reporting- to change calendar year to fiscal year, and add independent to the description of the annual audit
 - Reader’s Notes: Change representatives to delegates (p. 24)
 - Copyedit to correct error: add the (p.24) and other edits (pp 15 and 31)
 - Change to inspection clause description on page 37 of the Reader’s Notes

Fellowship Intellectual Property Trust Bulletin #1 Changes:

- Clarify: reproduction of recovery literature allowed by groups for currently approved versions
 - This is what NAWS is authorized to publish and distribute
 - This permission does not include electronic or online formats
- Require permissions to reprint book length pieces
- Rewrite introduction and move copyright section before trademarks
- Using the term policy throughout the documents, rather than a mix of *policy* and *guidelines*

Use Granted for Most Recent Editions of Literature:

- 1991: before Bulletin #1, in response to lawsuit, WSC statement/policy:
The Basic Text, Fifth Edition, is the only edition of the Basic text that is currently approved by the World Service Conference of Narcotics Anonymous for publication and sale. The World Service Office Board of Directors is entrusted with the responsibility for protecting the fellowship's physical and intellectual properties, including the Basic Text, and at the board of directors' discretion, shall that legal action to protect those rights against any and all persons who choose to infringe upon this literature trust.
- WSC 2008 approved Sixth Edition Basic Text as the only edition approved for NAWS production, with exceptions called out in the Translations Policy

Article 7, Section 2: Revision of Trust Instrument

- Provisions of the Trust Instrument may be changed only under the following conditions:
 - Any motion to review proposed revisions to the Trust Instrument must receive the approval of a majority of regional delegates at the World Service Conference.
 - After such review is approved, proposed revisions will be open for a six-month review and input period, after which the proposed revisions will be presented in the conference Agenda Report for adoption.
 - A motion to adopt any proposed revisions to the Trust Instrument will require a vote of "yes" from two-thirds of those regional delegates recorded as present in the World Service Conference roll call immediately prior to the vote.

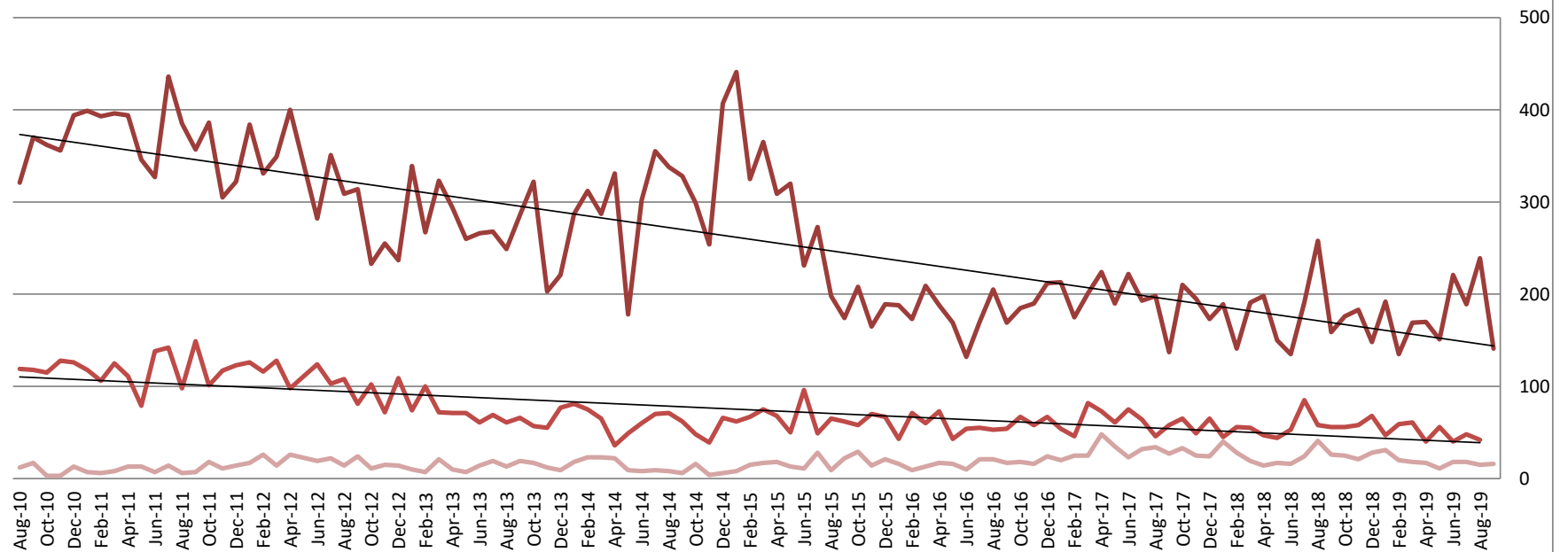
The NA Minnesota Regional Helpline 877-767-7676 serves the entire Minnesota region. Volunteers answer calls on their cell phones from addicts across the state 24 hours a day, seven days a week. If you are an active NA member with 6 months clean, NA needs you to answer helpline calls. You can answer as little as one 3-hour shift a week. All you need is a phone, helpline manual and a current regional meeting list. Just fill out the form at NAMinnesota.org under the Help Wanted menu. You will receive an email with the Helpline Orientation manual-read the manual, discuss it with the Helpline manager, choose your shifts, and start answering calls! Sign up today:

Last month the Minnesota helpline transitioned to a Yap-powered meeting list recording for option #2. The Helpline will be fully converted over the course of the next few months to this new service provider. This conversion will provide only two options on the helpline: #1 Talk to a volunteer, #2 Find a meeting. The new service has limited reporting ability currently, although it is constantly upgrading. We will not have detail regarding missed calls and which shifts are receiving calls/missing calls. But we expect to save approximately \$70/month. It is important our region make this transition in the spirit of prudent use of NA funds. It is most important that we continue to encourage members to become Helpline Volunteers and participate in this Amazing Service Opportunity!!

Transition Fairs



Narcotics Anonymous has been invited to participate in Transition Fairs at Minnesota Correctional Facilities across Minnesota. These Transition Fairs present opportunities for offenders with 16 months or less to serve. We participate with community contacts for housing, halfway houses, transportation, employment, training and support, and a variety of other community resources. Approximately 300 offenders at the facility are invited to attend.

Helpline Volunteers



If you have a phone, you can be a helpline volunteer and make a positive difference in the lives of addicts in need. Helpline training workshops are scheduled around the state and online with a conference call. To volunteer all you need to do is attend one training workshop scheduled just for you. After completing the workshop, you can volunteer for one or more 3-hour shifts per week.

Pen Pals



Many NA members who are incarcerated don’t have the ability to experience the miracle of sponsorship face to face. Still, many of them are looking for someone to sponsor them through the mail. With this program, the addicts behind the walls send a letter to the SBTW P.O. Box. Your sponsee’s letter is forwarded to you either through email or regular mail, whichever is best for you. Then you respond to your sponsee directly using the P.O. Box as your return address.

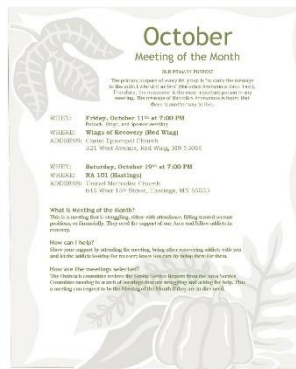
